Raised in Wasilla, Alaska, CDR James A. Steele enlisted in the Navy in 1997 as a nuclear electrician's mate. While serving aboard USS Parche (SSN 683), he accepted into the Enlisted was Commissioning Program (ECP). He graduated from the University of Washington in 2004 with a Bachelor of Science in Chemistry. In 2009, he earned degree a master's in engineering management from Old Dominion University.

His sea tours include serving as the antisubmarine warfare officer aboard USS Momsen (DDG 92); reactor controls division officer aboard USS Enterprise (CVN 65); operations officer aboard USS Ford (FFG 54); and reactor training assistant aboard USS George Washington (CVN 73).

Ashore, he served as the reactor dynamics and core characteristics division director at Naval Nuclear Power School and as the rotational global force management division director for U.S. Africa Command.

His previous assignment was executive officer, USS Kansas City (LCS 22) and then NTAG Portland, Oregon. CDR Steele assumed duties as Commanding Officer, Navy Talent Acquisition Group Portland, on January 12, 2023.

His awards and decorations include the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (four awards), Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (two awards), and various unit and campaign awards.

LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE REPORT By LTC Gary Battles, USAR (Ret), Co-Legislative Committee Chair

Grassroots advocacy is highly effective early in the year. MOAA asks that you get a hold of your members of Congress (MOC) and ask them to support the issues that I will outline below. You can do this via the **MOAA Legislative Action Center** located on the MOAA website (www.moaa.org). Of 363,000 members, only 21,000 have used the action center. Just go to the website and hit "Advocacy," followed by the "Legislative Action Center." You will be directed to your members of congress and will see an already developed letter for you to use.

You can also call the Capital Hot Line toll-free at **866-272-6622**. Make sure you ask to talk to the **military staffer**. If they are not available, leave a message stating you are a constituent, you are a member of MOAA, and that you wish to have them return your call. When you speak to them, please refer to the House Resolution (HR) or Senate Bill (SB) that I have listed below.

Priorities for **2024** are many leftover issues from 2023.

- They include The Major Richard Star Act which provides concurrent receipt for combat injured service members (HR 1282 and SB344).
- Ask you Member of Congress (MOC) to restore the Basic Allowance for Housing in their National Defense Authorization Act [(NDAA) HR 2537 and SB 1823].
- Arlington Cemetery is quickly running out of space. Ask your MOC to support the expanding American National Security Act (HR 1413) which will provide a long-term solution for more space.

- Ask your MOC to support The Respect for Grieving Military Family Act, which recoups the service members last month retirement payment (HR 3232 and SB1588).
- Finally, HR 1045 and SB 956, The Health Care Fairness for Military Families Act, will ensure that military kids transitioning to adults have the same health care protection as their peers in civilian families.
